What are those symbols shown in menus on Mac?

Many app menus on your Mac show key combinations, such as $\mathbb{H}\mathbb{N}$, next to certain menu options. The symbols in the key combinations represent special keyboard keys, called *modifier keys*.

You can press the key combinations shown in menus to perform actions without opening the menus.
